Pastors Voice Chastity as Virtue

By the light of faith, we discover chastity as a supernatural virtue. "Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God? You are not your own; you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body." (1 Cor. 6:19-20)

Saint Agustine is noted to have famously said to God prior to his conversion to the Christian Faith, "give me chastity and temperance, but not yet!" After many trials, this man went on to become a renowned saint and Doctor of the Church – meaning - his writings and teachings have particular importance and value. If he found it a struggle to live a 'chaste' life, then we can take solace and acknowledge that this is a very real area of struggle and temptation for all of us. No matter what our particular struggle with chastity, all of us are called by Christ to live it.

Thankfully, the virtue of chastity, while absolutely requiring our cooperation and real exertion of will, is primarily a work of the Holy Spirit, a gift that is ours for the asking. If someone is to realize that chastity is a virtue that they would like to embrace, what should they do? Desiring any virtue is a good and necessary starting point. We are fortunate, that no

matter our circumstances, we can begin again. We are blessed in the Catholic tradition that we can always make fresh starts in life with the grace offered in the Sacrament of reconciliation.

The important part is acknowledging our struggle, bringing it to God in confession and then beginning anew.

* Chastity derives from the virtue of temperance. Temperance controls our desire for sensual pleasures.
