The Pastors Voice

Devotions - Pilgrimage

The ultimate pilgrimage was taken by Christ himself. By coming down to Earth and walking in the flesh with his people, he joined the physical and spiritual journey of humanity. He traveled far and wide with his disciples to bring the message of the Gospel. Then, by his death, resurrection, and ascension into heaven, he completed his earthly pilgrimage, calling us to walk in the "way" of the Lord, as he walks with us. It was after Christ's death and resurrection that the type of pilgrimage we know of today started to become established. Ever since Jesus walked this earth, pilgrims have been traveling to the Holy Land to celebrate the person and journey of Christ.

A pilgrimage is a spiritual journey. It can be made anywhere, by anyone, for just about any spiritual purpose. For Catholics, it means traveling to a destination — whether it's a holy site, outdoor space, or even near to home — to experience God in a unique way. The goal is always transformation. Anyone can travel to a location, but the pilgrim seeks to encounter something deeper. In that way, a pilgrimage is never truly finished, because hopefully you will come back changed, unable to return to old ways of living or thinking.

Pilgrimages are an intentional encounter with the story of God's work in the world. To go on pilgrimage really means to step out of ourselves in order to encounter God where he has revealed himself, where his grace has shone with particular splendor and produced rich fruits of conversion and holiness among those who believe. Always remember we can encounter God in all of creation.
