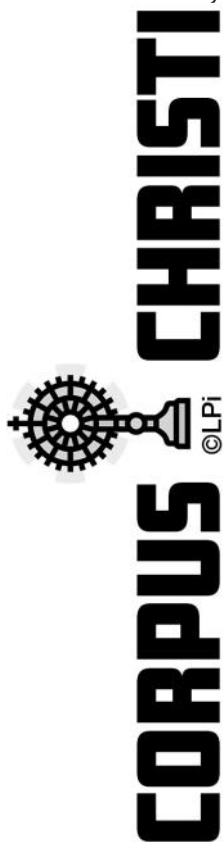
## Second Collection Next Week

## Pastors Voice

### Feast of Corpus Christy (the Body of Christ) – Processions

Many may have participated in Corpus Christi processions, a triumphant liturgical procession in which the sacred host which was consecrated during the Mass is carried out of the Church for the Christian faithful to make public profession of faith and worship of the Most Blessed Sacrament.”

These processions for Corpus Christi originated in Germany around 1275. By 1350, as the feast had become a universal practice, so too had the processions. In the Middle Ages, these processions were regarded with great importance both in the Church and in wider society.

As the centuries went on, the feast day and its celebration continued to flourish. The fifteenth-century popes Martin V and Eugene IV both issued letters concerning Corpus Christi. In the sixteenth century, the feast and its procession even made it into an *anathema\* sit statement*—*canon 6 of the 13th session of the Council of Trent*:

“If anyone says that in the holy sacrament of the Eucharist, Christ, the only begotten Son of God, is not to be adored with the worship of *latria*, also outwardly manifested, and is consequently neither to be venerated with a special festive solemnity, nor to be solemnly borne about in procession according to the laudable and universal rite and custom of holy Church, or is not to be set publicly before the people to be adored and that the adorers thereof are idolaters, let him be anathema.”

Corpus Christi processions remain a common practice today.

\* Anathema is a ceremonial form of excommunication. In Church decrees it is usually used to define final truth of something, for example: Whoever says that God is not one, let him be anathema.
