



Pastors Voice

"Catholic social teaching is a central and essential element of our faith.

"USCCB.org – social justice - (US Conference of Catholic Bishops)

The person is not only sacred but also social. How we organize our society—in economics and politics, in law and policy—directly affects human dignity and the capacity of individuals to grow in community. Marriage and the family are the central social institutions that must be supported and strengthened, not undermined. We believe people have a right and a duty to participate in society, seeking together the common good and well-being of all, especially the poor and vulnerable.

The second principle of Catholic Social teaching:

<u>CALL TO FAMILY, COMMUNITY, AND PARTICIPATION</u>

<u>Genesis 2:18</u> It is not good for man to be alone

Genesis 4:8-15 I am my brother's and sister's keeper.

<u>Leviticus 25:23-43</u> What you own belongs to the Lord and is given for the good of all.

<u>Jeremiah 7:5-7</u> If you act justly with one another, God will dwell in the land.

Micah 6:6-8 Act justly, love kindness, walk humbly with God.

<u>John 15:12-17</u> This is my commandment: love one another as I have loved you.

Acts 2:43-47 Life among the believers.

Romans 12:4-8 We are one body, individually members one of another.

<u>Hebrews 10:24-25</u> Rouse one another to love and good works.

James 2:14-17 Our faith is dead if we ignore others in need.

<u>1Peter 4:8-11</u> Serve one another with the gifts you have received.

<u>John 3:16-18</u> We ought to lay down our lives for one another.

1 John 4:19-21 Those who love God must love their brothers and sisters.

FAMILY: "The first and fundamental structure for a 'human ecology' is the family - founded on marriage, in which the mutual gift of self as husband and wife creates an environment in which children can be born and develop their potentialities, become aware of their dignity and prepare to face their unique and individual destiny." (Pope St. John Paul II, On the Hundredth Year [Centesimus Annus], no. 39)

COMMUNITY, AND PARTICIPATION; "But God did not create man as a solitary, for from the beginning 'male and female he created them' (Gen. 1:27). Their companionship produces the primary form of interpersonal communion. For by his innermost nature man is a social being, and unless he relates himself to others, he can neither live nor develop his potential." (Second Vatican Council, *The Church in the Modern World [Gaudium et Spes]*, no. 12)
