

#### **Pastors Voice**

"Catholic social teaching is a central and essential element of our faith.
"USCCB.org – social justice - (US Conference of Catholic Bishops)
A basic moral test is how our most vulnerable members are faring. In a society marred by deepening divisions between rich and poor, our tradition recalls the story of the Last Judgment (Mt 25:31-46) and instructs us to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains, "To receive in truth the Body and Blood of Christ given up for us, we must recognize Christ in the poorest of brethren" (no. 1397).

The fourth principle of Catholic Social teaching: OPTION FOR THE POOR AND VULNERABLE

Exodus 22:20-26 You shall not oppress the poor or vulnerable. God will hear their cry.

<u>Leviticus 19:9-10</u> A portion of the harvest is set aside for the poor and the stranger.

Job 34:20-28 The Lord hears the cry of the poor

<u>Proverbs 31:8-9</u> Speak out in defense of the poor.

Sirach 4:1-10 Don't delay giving to those in need.

<u>Isaiah 25:4-5</u> God is a refuge for the poor.

<u>Isaiah 58:5-7</u> True worship is to work for justice and care for the poor and oppressed.

Matthew 25:34-40 What you do for the least among you, you do for Jesus.

<u>Luke 4:16-21</u> Jesus proclaims his mission: to bring good news to the poor and oppressed.

<u>Luke 6:20-23</u> Blessed are the poor, theirs is the kingdom of God.

1 John 3:17-18 How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's good and sees one in need and refuses to help?

"The needs of the poor take priority over the desires of the rich; the rights of workers over the maximization of profits; the preservation of the environment over uncontrolled industrial expansion; the production to meet social needs over production for military purposes." (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, Economic Justice for All, no. 94 citing St. John Paul II's Address September 14, 1984)
