Pastors Voice

During the Middle Ages, two popular interpretations of vestments arose: one viewing them as symbols of Jesus' Passion and the other as symbols of the priest as a soldier of Christ fighting against sin and Satan.

The Council of Trent implicitly acknowledges the traditional practice of using vestments during the Mass. Upholding use of ceremonial vestments during the celebration of masses as being "derived from an apostolic discipline and tradition."

The Council of Trent took place from 1545 to 1563. It was a series of meetings held in Trent, Italy, and was a pivotal event in the Catholic Counter-Reformation. The council addressed issues raised by the Protestant Reformation and reaffirmed Catholic doctrines and practices. The Council of Trent concluded with the publication of decrees and canons that reformed the Catholic Church and reaffirmed its core beliefs. These decrees shaped Catholic doctrine and practice for centuries to come.
