## The Rites of the Catholic Church

Catholic rites are a set of ceremonies, practices and forms of worship that are used in the celebration of the liturgy and the sacraments.

The word Catholic means “universal,” the Church is Catholic because she is present throughout the world. Her mission is to proclaim the fullness of the faith and to administer the sacraments instituted by Christ for the salvation of souls - this universality doesn’t mean uniformity.

Throughout history, as the early church grew, it celebrated the sacraments as would be best understood and received in the context of individual cultures, without ever changing their essential form and matter. The early Church sought to evangelize in the major cultural centers of the first centuries A.D. These centers were Rome, Antioch (Syria), and Alexandria (Egypt). All the rites in use today evolved from the liturgical practices and ecclesiastical organization used by the churches in these cities. While different liturgical, spiritual, and disciplinary traditions arose, they are distinct in form, they share the same faith and the same sacraments. These traditions have given rise to the various Catholic rites celebrated in particular Churches, both in the West and the East.

A short explanation would be. . . first, we have the Catholic Church. No prefixes. No other labels. We just have the Catholic Church. Or, if one really wants to, we can refer to the Universal (Catholic) Church. Second, the Catholic Church is comprised of 6 different liturgical rites and within those rites, there are 24 particular Churches. These 24 autonomous or self-governing Churches are all in communion with one another, are all within the Catholic Church, and all recognize the primacy of the pope. The 1990 Code of Canons of the Eastern Churches defines a rite as “the liturgical, theological, spiritual and disciplinary patrimony, culture and circumstances of history of a distinct people, by which its own manner of living the faith is manifested in each Church sui iuris.”

All the rites of the Catholic Church are of equal dignity and equally valid. Attendance at a different rite fulfills the Sunday obligation. The Catholic Church is truly universal since it unites so many diverse rites, whose members share a common faith.
