PALMS FOR ASHES Please bring in your palms from last year and place them in the box in the church vestibule. Then join us on Tuesday, February 17 at 11:00 in the school courtyard when we will burn the palms, creating the ashes to be used on Ash Wednesday.

ASH WEDNESDAY is February 18. Masses will be at 8:30 AM, 12:30 PM in Challenge, and at 6:00 PM which will be a bi-lingual mass. Ashes will be distributed at all masses. There will also be a service for Imposition of Ashes outside of mass at 12:00 noon on Ash Wednesday.

SOUP AND STATIONS Our Lenten tradition of Friday evening Stations of the Cross will begin on February 20 and continue through March 27. A simple soup supper will be served at 6:00 PM in the Community Center, followed at 6:45 with Stations in the Church. Stations of the Cross are also led by St. Thomas students on Tuesday mornings at 9 AM.

A HEALING MASS will take place on Thursday, February 26 at 11:00 for those with health issues, chronic illnesses, or upcoming surgeries. During mass, Father will administer the Sacrament of the Sick and anoint those who are present. After mass, there is a luncheon reception in the Community Center, served by the Altar Society.

The Pastors Voice

The Western Rites of the Catholic Church

LATIN / ROMAN:

The Catholic Church does not claim Jesus explicitly instructed Peter to establish the "Roman Catholic Church" as a named institution. Instead, it teaches that Christ gave Peter a foundational role, as seen in *Matthew 16:18-19 and other scriptures. This role included authority to govern and unify the Church. Peter's leadership, martyrdom in Rome, and the Church's historical development under the Holy Spirit led to the Roman Catholic Church's structure. The papacy, as Peter's succession, continues to serve the Church's universal mission. The Church's teachings, rooted in scripture and tradition, affirm this understanding (CCC 881-882). The Roman center is a practical expression of Peter's role, not its essence. The Church remains focused on its mission to proclaim Christ to all nations. This mission, entrusted to Peter, defines its identity. The Catholic answer is thus one of continuity, guided by Christ's words and the Spirit's presence.*

The ordinary form of liturgy in the Latin/Roman Rite traces its origins to the first centuries of Christianity in Rome. It developed in Latin and, in essence, has remained intact since at least the 4th century. It follows the Missal of Pope St. Pius V (1566-1572). Over the centuries, she has developed several Catholic rites, the most widespread being the Roman Rite. Historically, there were numerous local variants of the Roman Rite across the West. After the Council of Trent (1545– 1563), Pope St. Pius V, through the Apostolic Constitution *Quo Primum* (1570), *standardized the liturgy, making the Roman Rite the norm for the Latin Church. Exceptions were allowed only for liturgical traditions with over 200 years of continuous usage.*
